Arrangements for the children of Key Workers

Last month the government has published a list of key workers. An email link can be found to this list at the bottom of this document.

This letter is an update and includes the arrangements for the two weeks beginning Monday 13th April 2020 i.e. the last week of the Easter holidays and the first week back after the Easter break.

Our Lady of Mercy Catholic Education Trust has been offering key worker support to the students of St. Anthony's and St. Aidan's with parents/carers who are key workers and have no alternative childcare.

The reason for school closures is to allow social distancing. Therefore, it is imperative that if there is an appropriate adult in the family students are expected to remain at home. If any person in the family home displays symptoms of a new continuous cough or a high temperature the whole family are expected to self-isolate for 14 days. It is also important to consider any member of the family with underlying health conditions. The less contact they have with the outside world over the next twelve weeks the better.

Supervised study for the children of key worker children will start at 8.30 am and finish at 3.30 pm.

For the week beginning **Tuesday 14th April 2020 to Friday 17th April 2020**, it will be based at **St. Anthony's School**.

N.B. WE ARE NOT OPEN BANK HOLIDAY MONDAY. This is due to there being no requests from keyworkers from either school for this date.

For the week beginning **Monday 20th April 2020 to Friday 24th April 2020**, it will be based at **St. Aidan's School**.

Both weeks will be run by staff from both St. Anthony's and St. Aidan's.

Your son/daughter is expected to wear full school uniform. Breakfast will be available from 8.30 am to 9.00 am and a lunch will also be provided.

Students should bring PE kit every day. We plan to build a period of physical exercise into the day.

Students will not be taught form lessons. We do not have the staff to do this. They will be supervised in classrooms and will complete the tasks set for all students by relevant school which has already been communicated to you by each school.

We understand that your situation may differ from day to day. If you are in a position where you need your son/daughter to attend, please inform us the day before by 4.00 pm if your son/daughter will need to attend. You will need to do this every day you need to send your son/daughter.
