The buzz around the place with both staff and students reengaging with a taught curriculum was great to see. However, we were able to give the students instruction and support in the core subjects as well as some directed physical activity. Despite an initial wariness, the students quickly adapted and the sessions were purposeful and well structured. The students left with a keen sense of renewed purpose and invigorated to pick up their studies and push themselves on in preparation for Y11. We also were delighted to see our Y12 students via our remote seminars. The subject based discussions that were had were of high quality and challenging to all. From Monday my team will be rolling out a new and more robust Home Learning strategy for the entire student body. This has face to face video tutorials at its heart and will allow the students to feel more of a connection with St Aidan's with staff that they know. They will also be able to ask questions through TEAMS and staff will be on hand to give support to groups of students who feel they need it. We continue to put the student at the heart of our decision making and this initial step was an important and welcome one. Thank you for your continued support and God bless.
