Our Community

At St Aidan's we have our own foodbank. We believe it is important to live out the values of Christ through supporting our community. Pupils get involved through donations, stacking shelves, taking care of inventory and producing and delivering hampers.

The opportunities our young people have to develop their spiritual and emotion wellbeing spread from 11-18. Many of our older pupils successfully achieve the John Paul II Award for actively participating in the life of their Church - in the life of their community and society. Success

At St Aidan's, we know that a holistic education is about more than academic results, but we are nevertheless very proud of the achievements of our pupils.

Our pupils' performance at GCSE is consistently outstanding with amongst the highest achievements not just in Sunderland, but in the North East of England. St Aidan's pupils thrive on challenge and sit at least 8 GCSEs or equivalents, before specialising in three subjects at A Level.

The destination list of our leavers is particularly impressive with pupils moving on to a range of Universities, from local ones such as Durham and Newcastle, to ones further afield in Cambridge and Oxford.

A significantly high proportion of our pupils attain the strong pass (5+) in GCSE English and Maths. The remarkable performance of our pupils means that St Aidan's consistently records amongst the highest results of any school in Sunderland and Washington.

Our Sixth Form is housed across our beautiful St Anthony's and St Aidan's campus, with the curriculum offering a wide and diverse range of facilitating subjects to allow pupils to specialise in their preferred field. Pupil performances at A Level are outstanding, with the majority of pupils achieving Grades A*-B and gaining access to their first choice of Russell Group Universities.



Our Curriculum

We have the highest of expectations for every individual, and our practices and routines nurture a strong sense of moral purpose, personal responsibility, integrity, honesty and respect for others within our pupils.

The curriculum, supported by our mission as a Catholic school, is academically challenging and diverse offering a range of rigorous GCSEs with vocational options available. From commencement of Year 7 and Key Stage 3 our pupils encounter a breadth of experience: from reading the greatest works in English Literature to discussing the most defining moments in World history, and from witnessing the greatest minds of Maths and Science to the joy that comes from playing with an orchestra, or the exhilaration of being part of a team on a sports field. In Key Stage 4 pupils specialise through the EBacc route and developed the independence to make decisions, supported by their teachers and parents, around where they believe their talents lie, with options of Music, Media, Business, ICT, Art, DT, PE and Engineering.







By Key Stage 5 pupils experience the choice of a competitive range of qualifications to high quality A level subjects and relevant vocational subjects to enable them to climb to their next step of University or career.

We believe that the curriculum at St Aidan's is the best vehicle for preparing pupils for the next phase of education, employment and life. The curriculum focusses relentlessly and unapologetically on the key concepts that underpin each subject and supports pupils in climbing their mountain to University or a real alternative.





Pastoral Support

Our very strong and experienced pastoral team are relentless in their approach to supporting pupils through transition and beyond.

All members of the team are highly trained to deal with friendships, mental health and bereavement.

We work closely with external agencies to provide 1-1 counselling, risk and resilience support and any intervention that we cannot provide in house.

Safeguarding our boys is at the heart of everything that we do. Every member of staff is vigilant and helps the pastoral team in planning the appropriate support for each and every pupil.

Our school nursing team are on hand to support for health related questions from pupils with weekly stalls at lunchtime.



Enrichment

We run a diverse range of before and after school activities and clubs to afford our pupils the ability to explore their interests outside the classroom in a friendly, supportive and familiar environment. The experiences offer something for everyone's taste whether it be skiing, crafts, fishing, Lego, chess or Science.

Educational Visits

Educational visits play a vital role in our pupils' academic and personal development. We offer a wide range of local, national and international experiences.

Year 7 pupils experience climbing their first Lake District mountain on arrival at St Aidan's. Pupils continue to climb academically, spiritually and personally and complement this journey by climbing more challenging mountains in Years 8 and 9. In addition to the many local visits we offer to all year groups, one of the most popular international trips is to the battlefields of Northern France and Belgium. This is an opportunity for our Year 9 history pupils to witness the scale of the World Wars to complement the classroom experience. In recent years, our pupils have also had the opportunity to experience life and perspective changing charitable trips to Nepal, China, Ecuador and India

Careers Education and Information, Advice and Guidance

We aim to develop pupils who are employable, confident and ambitious with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in their chosen career'. We deliver a careers programme that supports the aspirations of all our pupils; it allows exploration and reflection so that informed decisions are made at key transition points. We believe that effective careers education and guidance not only contributes to the wellbeing of individuals but also to the wellbeing of their families, the communities to which they belong, wider society, businesses and the economy.

We work with our partners in the community to offer a range of exciting employers talks, work place visits and experiences of work in a range of industries, this will help to introduce you to the world of work and build your knowledge of the local labour market. Partners from Higher education, Further education and local training providers all contribute towards the careers programme in school, as well as exploring careers each year within PDE lessons. Career Guidance meetings are scheduled for all pupils at key transition points with the schools careers advisor, drop in appointments can be made as and when throughout the year.
