On Monday 29th September the under 16 basketball side played their first ever match in the Dynamix National Cup.






>>> YEAR 7 HOUSE TRIPS TO KESWICK - CLIMB YOUR MOUNTAIN!

Pass Out Procedure

To request a Pass Out for your child during school hours please email contactus@staca.co.uk

Please include the following details:

- 1. Full name
- 2. Form group
- 3. Date when the Pass Out is required
- 4. Reason for Pass Out e.g. hospital appointment etc.
- 5. Time you will be collecting your son from school.

You will be notified by email once it has been authorised. Your son should collect his Pass Out slip from the Student Support office prior to his appointment. Pupils must present the slip to their teacher at the beginning of their lesson, leave the classroom at the time stated on the Pass Out and make their way to the Main Reception.

We ask for a minimum of 48 hours notice for all Pass Out requests.
