“As we gather for our first week back after Christmas, we return carrying the quiet glow of the season—perhaps a little rested, perhaps still tired, but renewed. We have returned to the ordinary rhythms of school life, bringing with us all that this new term will hold. Christmas invited us to pause, to wonder, and to remember that God chooses to come close to us not in grandeur, but in simplicity—entering the everyday spaces of our lives, including our classrooms and our work together. At this time, the Feast of the Epiphany reminds us that the story of Christmas does not end at the manger. The Wise Men set out on a journey, guided by a light that led them to truth, hope, and transformation. Having encountered Christ, they returned home changed, carrying that light into their own places and responsibilities. Their journey did not end when they found Jesus; in many ways, it began there.

As we begin a new term, we too are invited to begin again. We return to our shared mission, called to notice and follow the light God places before us. In our patience, kindness, encouragement, and daily acts of care, we are called to be bearers of that light for our community. Connect with someone from a different generation, talk to your parents and grandparents, find out something new about them and share something about you.

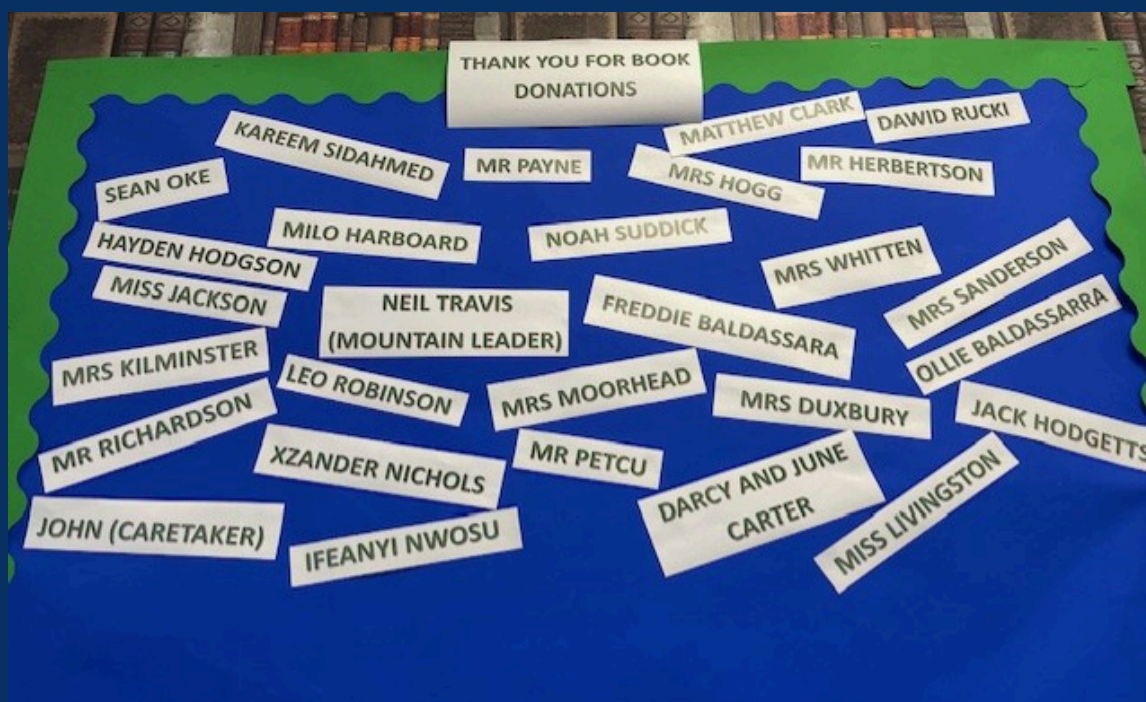
BOOK DONATIONS


